#### Background Information

Organized as Ordnance Travelling Workshop under the command of Captain A. S. Buttenshaw.

Authorization published in General Order 63 of 15 June 1917.

Became No. 26 Canadian Travelling Ordnance Workshop Unit.

Joined No. 23 Ordnance Workshop (Imperial) at Bailleul 15 March 1916.

Redesignated as 81st Canadian Ordnance Workshop Unit (Light) 27 November 1928.

Disbanded by General Order 193 of 1 November 1920.

Redesignated as 82nd Canadian Ordnance Workshop Unit (Light) 27 November 1918.

#### **Background Information**

Organized in France in October 1918 to work on siege artillery equipment.

Originally No. 8 Medium Canadian Ordnance Mobile Workshop.

Commanded by Lieutenant A. Philipps.

Redesignated as 83rd Canadian Ordnance Workshop Unit (Medium) 27 November 1918.

Returned to England in May 1919.
